

Temporary Emergency Phytosanitary Ordinance by Agriculture and Livestock Service (SAG) of Chile

April 16, 2012

Dear Clients:

Please be advised that Chilean Agriculture and Livestock Authority ("SAG") has recently issued a provisional regulation to control the entry into Chile of two pests, the Asian Gypsy Moth and the Brown Marmorated Stink Bug.

The regulations apply to any product that consists of used clothes, toys and used vehicles (cars, trucks, machinery among others) that are imported to Chile from USA, China, Korea, Japan and Taiwan. The aforementioned goods must carry an original Phytosanitary Treatment Certificate, which has to be presented to SAG upon arrival to Chile.

It is required for the certificate to contain the following:

- a) Name of company that carried out the treatment
- b) Name and address of exporting Company
- c) Date when treatment was carried out, which must be applied at place of origin, with max. 5 days prior to loading.
- d) Description of treated commodity type and quantity
- e) Treatment applied to goods (indicating product applied, dose, minimum temperature of process and exposure time)

If you intend to carry any goods described above, please immediately contact the Carrier for further clarification at . Also keep in mind that according to BBC Bills of Lading Clause 11(b) shippers are responsible for all costs and expenses of fumigation.
